PRIMARY ENFORCEMENT SEAT BELT LAWS

should be adopted by every state. Federal legislation is needed to accelerate the pace, just as it did for the 21 drinking age and .08 percent BAC.

TEEN DRIVERS

Graduated Driver Licensing programs need to be strengthened nationwide. In particular, states should increase the hours of supervised driving and place tougher restrictions on the number of passengers allowed before full licensure.

ALL-RIDER MOTORCYCLE HELMET LAWS

should be passed in the 30 states still lacking them and repeal efforts should be stopped.

BOOSTER SEATS

should be required for children ages 4 to 8 in every state.

DRUNK DRIVING

is involved in 40% of all motor vehicle deaths. Key impaired driving laws are languishing in legislatures and states need to act.
